# **Team Spotlight:**

# TONY POLLARD

- Tony Pollard leads the NFL in both carries (62) and touches (74). Pollard's 74 touches are the most by a Cowboys player through the first three games of a season since Ezekiel Elliott had 76 touches in the first three contests of his rookie season in 2016.
- Pollard has punished opposing defenses after initial contact in 2023, totaling 168 yards after contact on rushes, good for third in the NFL this season behind Christian McCaffrey (269) and Jerome Ford (169).
- Despite leading the league in carries, Pollard's big play ability has not gone away. Through three games in 2023, Pollard is one-of-four running backs with at least three rushes of 20-plus yards, joining James Conner, D'Andre Swift and De'Von Achane.

The Cowboys have had no problem sustaining long drives in 2023. After finishing with the 17th-most 10-play drives (31) in 2022, Dallas leads the NFL in 2023 with 12 different 10-play drives.

#### **MICAH PARSONS**

- \* Micah Parsons has recorded a sack in each of the first three games. With a sack against New England, Parsons would become the third Cowboys defender to tally a sack in each of the first four games of a season, joining De-Marcus Lawrence (2017) and DeMarcus Ware (2008).
- \* Parsons has 10 career games with 2.0-or-more sacks, the most in Cowboys history through 36 career games. With 2.0 sacks against New England, Parsons would have the second-most 2.0-sack games by a NFL player through 37 career contests since 1982, trailing only Reggie White (13).

#### **BRANDON AUBREY**

- \* Brandon Aubrey has attempted and made all 10 of his field goal attempts in 2023. He is the first kicker in the Super Bowl era to make his first 10 field goal attempts in the first three games of his career.
- Aubrey has racked up plenty of kicking points through three games. Aubrey's 26 kicking points are tied for the league lead in 2023 and are tied for the second-most kicking points through a player's first three career games in NFL history, trailing only former Cowboys kicker Richie Cunningham (44 in 1997).

#### **TONY POLLARD**

- Tony Pollard leads the NFL with 62 carries and 74 touches. Pollard's 74 touches are the most by a Cowboys player through the first three games of a season since Ezekiel Elliott had 76 touches in the first three contests of his rookie season in 2016.
- Pollard is coming off a 122-yard rushing performance at Arizona (9/17) and has seven career 100-yard games.
   With 100 rushing yards against New England, Pollard would tie Julius Jones and Marion Barber for the eighthmost 100-yard rushing games through a Cowboys player's first five seasons.

#### CEEDEE LAMB

- \* CeeDee Lamb has four career games with 10-plus catches, the most by any Cowboys receiver in his first four seasons. With one more 10-catch performance, Lamb would tie Amari Cooper for the third-most games (five) with 10-or-more catches by a Cowboys receiver.
- Lamb has 19 receptions in 2023 and needs eight receptions on Sunday against New England to have the most receptions by a Cowboys player in the first four games of a season (27) since Jason Witten in 2011.

#### **DEMARCUS LAWRENCE**

DeMarcus Lawrence is tied for third on the Cowboys with 2.0 sacks in 2023 and has 56.5 sacks in his career. He needs 2.5 more sacks to tie Tony Tolbert (59.0) for the 11th-most sacks in franchise history.

#### **OSA ODIGHIZUWA**

Osa Odighizuwa has 3.0 sacks through three games in 2023, tied with Jason Hatcher (2013) and John Dutton (1986) for the most sacks by a Cowboys defensive tackle through the first three games of a season since 1982.


- The Cowboys are looking for their 10th consecutive win at AT&T Stadium on Sunday. The last time Dallas won 10 straight home games was when they won 11 games in a row in 1991-92 at Texas Stadium.
- \* With a win on Sunday, Head Coach Mike McCarthy will tie Bud Grant (158 wins) for 19th on the all-time wins list among NFL head coaches.
- \* After finishing with the 17th-most 10-play drives (31) in 2022, Dallas leads the NFL in 2023 with 12 different 10-play drives.

# ★ COWBOYS & TOM THUMB ★

Tom Thumb

This year, Tom Thumb will be celebrating their title game honoring breast cancer survivors as the supporting partner of the Star Survivors Program. As the presenting partner, Tom Thumb will be providing 5 Star Survivors with a VIP experience at The Star on September 28th complete with a tour, meet and greets with Dallas Cowboys Cheerleaders and players, a shopping spree at the Dallas Cowboys Pro Shop, Kendra Scott, and JCPenney, Q&A with Charlotte Jones, lunch at Cowboys Club, and gifts including \$500 to Tom Thumb. They will also host the Star Survivors on game day and honoring them in a pregame ceremony with Charlotte Jones.

Additionally, on game day, Charlotte Jones and a Tom Thumb executive will present a check for \$320,000 to support cancer research and treatment via the Albertsons Companies Foundation. The contribution will go to programs at Susan G. Komen, Baylor Scott & White, and The American Cancer Society's "Gene & Jerry Jones Hope Lodge". Representatives from each organization with be present for the check presentation to celebrate the shared goal of bringing hope and treatment to those battling cancer.



# **★** WINNING HEAD COACH ★

The Dallas Cowboys named Mike McCarthy the ninth head coach in franchise history on Jan. 5, 2020. Along with 13 years of head coaching experience and 13 additional years as an assistant coach in the NFL, McCarthy came to Dallas with a 125-77-2 regular season coaching record - all with the Green Bay Packers (2006-18).

After a 32-21 record in his fourth season with Dallas, he owns the fifth-most wins (20th all-time) and sixth-highest winning percentage (.615) among qualifying active NFL coaches. His teams have qualified for the postseason 11 times, won six NFC North Division titles and one NFC East title, made four NFC Championship Game appearances and took home a Super Bowl XLV championship.

# $\star$ HEAD COACHES $\star$

#### MIKE McCARTHY (157-98-2, 17th Year, 32-21 with Dallas)

The Dallas Cowboys named Mike McCarthy the ninth head coach in franchise history on Jan. 8, 2020, and he has led the franchise to back-to-back playoff appearances for the first time since 2006-07. He has also won 12 games in each of the last two seasons, the first time Dallas posted consecutive seasons with 12-plus wins since 1994-95.

McCarthy is in his 17th year as a head coach - 13 with Green Bay and four with Dallas - along with 13 years as an assistant coach in the NFL, including six as an offensive coordinator.

As a head coach, McCarthy has racked up a 157-98-2 regular season coaching record, and he owns the fifth-most wins (20th alltime) among active NFL coaches. His teams have qualified for the postseason 11 times, won six NFC North Division titles, one NFC East title, made four NFC Championship Game appearances and took home a Super Bowl XLV championship held at AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas, following the 2010 NFL season.

In 2022 McCarthy led the charges of a team that finished 12-5 for the second straight season to mark the first time in his career and the first time for Pallac since 1994 95 to record consecutive 12 plus win

first time for Dallas since 1994-95 to record consecutive 12-plus win seasons. En route to the team's second straight playoff berth (first time since 2006-07), the Dallas offense finished third in the league in points (467, fourth in points-per-game) while the defense led the league in takeaways for the second consecutive season.

During his time in Green Bay, McCarthy was known as a prolific offensive mind and the primary play-caller for the Packers. McCarthy's offense finished fourth in the NFL in total offense and third in points-per-game through his 14-year stint with the club.

McCarthy is only the fourth head coach in NFL history to lead a single franchise to eight-or-more consecutive playoff appearances, joining Tom Landry, Chuck Noll and Bill Belichick. Those eight appearances from 2009-16 were more than the rest of the NFC North Division combined over that span (Minnesota, three; Detroit, three; Chicago, one).

McCarthy's nine playoff appearances overall are the most by a Packers coach since the NFL postseason began in 1933, and he guided the Packers to a franchise-record fourth consecutive division title in 2014. With the victory over Dallas in the 2016 playoffs, Mc-Carthy surpassed Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren for the most playoff victories in team history (10).

#### BILL BELICHICK (299-154, 29th Year, 263-110 with NE)

Bill Belichick, one of the most accomplished coaches in NFL history enters his 49th season, and his 24th season as head coach of the New England Patriots. Belichick accepted the job on Jan. 27, 2000, with a franchise that previously had no Super Bowl championships.

Belichick is the only head coach in league history to win six Super Bowl titles. Belichick won his last Super Bowl in 2018, joining George Halas and Curly Lambeau as the only NFL coaches with six championships. Belichick has also delivered nine conference championships, 17 AFC East crowns and 30 playoff victories while posting an overall record of 299-154.

Entering 2023, Belichick owns the most wins among all active coaches and ranks second all-time with 329 total victories (including postseason) as a head coach. Belichick's winning percentage of .666 ranks second in NFL history among coaches with 150 or more wins, trailing only George Halas (.682). He led the Patriots to a winning record for 19 consecutive seasons (2001-19), behind only Dallas' Tom Landry, who recorded 20 consecutive winning seasons from 1966-85.

In 2022 the Patriots overcame a 1-3 start by winning five of their next six games before finishing 8-9 and missing out on the postseason by one game. Belichick's defense finished eighth in the NFL in yards allowed and tied second in the NFL with 30 takeaways (Dallas had 33).

In his 49th season, Belichick holds the NFL mark for most consecutive seasons as an NFL coach. Belichick began his coaching career as a staff assistant with the Baltimore Colts in 1975 after graduating from Wesleyan University. He was named special assistant to Head Coach Ted Marchibroda at the age of 23. The following season, Belichick joined the Detroit Lions as an assistant special teams coach. In 1977 he was promoted to the tight ends and receivers coach for Detroit. After two seasons with Detroit, Belichick became the assistant special teams coach and assistant to defensive coordinator Joe Collier for the Denver Broncos.

He spent 12 seasons with the New York Giants (1979-90) before becoming head coach of the Cleveland Browns from 1991-95. He then joined the Patriots as assistant head coach/secondary coach under Bill Parcells for the 1996 season and left for the New York Jets the following season for the same title, where he served for three seasons. Belichick returned to New England in 2000 as head coach and turned the Patriots into the winningest NFL franchise of the 21st century thus far.

# $\star$ player highlights vs. Ne $\star$

#### Brandin Cooks - WR

Notched seven recpetions for 108 yards (15.4 avg) in two games against New England. Spent the 2017 season in New England where he recorded 65 receptions for 1,082 yards (16.6 avg.) and seven touchdowns as a Patriot.

#### Stephon Gilmore - CB

Tallied 34 tackles, two interceptions, two tackles for loss and seven pass breakups in his 10 meetups with the Patriots while playing with Buffalo, Carolina and Indianapolis. Spent four seasons in New England (2017-2020) where he totaled 179 tackles, one sack, two interceptions, two touchdowns, one quarterback pressure, three tackles for loss, four forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and 63 passes defended as a Patriot.

#### DeMarcus Lawrence - DE

Recorded six tackles, one quarterback pressure and two tackles for loss in two games against New England.

#### CeeDee Lamb - WR



# **★ PROTECTING DAK ★**

The Dallas offensive line was blitzed on 28.7% of its passing plays in 2022, the ninth-highest rate in the league. Despite the amount of pressure, the Cowboys were fourth in the NFL with 27 allowed sacks.

Through two games in 2023, Dallas is one-of-eight teams to allow three sacks-or-less despite being blitzed on 25.5% of its dropbacks. Overall, the Cowboys have allowed three sacks on 110 dropbacks for a 2.8% sack rate, tied for the third-lowest sack rate in 2023, according to *Pro Football Focus*:







Bland stepped up for the Dallas secondary, tying for second among NFL rookies with five interceptions, and his five picks were the most by a Cowboys rookie since 2002 (Roy Williams and Derek Ross).
