Dallas leads the NFL with five interceptions in the preseason. Combined with just one giveaway, the Cowboys +4 turnover differential ranks second in the league, trailing Houston (+8) who has played three preseason games.

339

Trey Lance has completed 40-of-64 passes (62.5%) for 339 yards in two preseason games, second in the NFL behind Stetson Bennett (437). Lance also leads all quarterbacks this preseason with 78 rushing yards.

66

Brandon Aubrey made a 66-yard field goal at the end of the first half at the Las Vegas Raiders. It was the longest field goal in a NFL preseason game in at least the last 10 years, and it would have tied Justin Tucker's NFL regular season game record that he set in 2022. Aubrey led the NFL and set a franchise record with 10 field goals from 50-plus yards in 2023.

★ Cowboys Summer Training Camp ★



The Dallas Cowboys returned to Oxnard, California to open their 65th training camp in 2024 at the Residence Inn at River Ridge. The 2024 camp, presented by American Airlines, marks the 45th year that the team has prepared for the upcoming season in California and the 18th time that the Cowboys have spent all, or a portion of, its camp at the Oxnard location. Dallas came back to the west coast permanently in 2012 after training in the Alamodome in San Antonio prior to the 2011 season.

The Cowboys are one-of-eight teams who will spend camp away from their home facilities - Buffalo, Indianapolis, Kansas City, Las Vegas, LA Rams, New Orleans and Pittsburgh. Excluding 2020, the 24 clubs (75 percent) that are opting to “stay home” are the fourth-most such teams since 2000. Teams considered to be “staying home” hold camp at their respective practice facility, home stadium or at a site within 10 miles of their team headquarters. In 2000, only 10 of 31 (32 percent) teams stayed close to home.

Training camp in Oxnard will conclude on Thursday, Aug. 22, as the team will return to Texas and wrap up the final portion of Cowboys training camp at Ford Center at The Star in Frisco, Texas. The Training Camp schedule in Frisco will kick off with Cowboys Night on Tuesday, August 27th at 4:00 p.m. outside on Tostitos Championship Plaza with a live DJ and host, mascot Rowdy, interactive games, giveaways and more. Doors to Ford Center will open to the public starting at 5:00 p.m. in advance of open practice from 6:00 – 7:00 p.m. The Season Kickoff Ceremony and a second open practice will take place on Wednesday, August 28th. The ceremony will take place at 5:40 p.m. before the 6:00 p.m. hour-long open practice session. Doors to the Season Kickoff Ceremony open at 5:00.

★ Training Camp History ★

June 3, 1960 – The newly formed Dallas Cowboys franchise announced that it will train at Pacific University in Forest Grove, Oregon. Rookies reported on July 9.

May 24, 1961 – Due to its proximity to their first exhibition game against Minnesota in Minneapolis, the Dallas Cowboys moved training camp to St. Olaf College in Northfield, Minn. Camp opened on July 9.

June 8, 1962 – The Dallas Cowboys moved their training camp site to the campus of Northern Michigan College on the shores of Lake Superior in Marquette, Mich. Rookies reported on July 13.

July 12, 1963 – Because the team played three of its first four preseason games on the west coast, the Dallas Cowboys moved training camp to California Lutheran College in Thousand Oaks, Calif. This camp, which was the first of 27 at CLC, opened on July 12.

Dec. 6, 1989 – For the first time in the 30-year history of the team, the Dallas Cowboys trained in Texas as the club announced its 1990 training camp would be held at St. Edward’s University in Austin, Texas. This camp, the first of eight at St. Ed’s, opened on July 22.

Feb. 17, 1998 – The Cowboys began a four-year stay at Midwestern State University in Wichita Falls, Texas, with their 1998 camp. The first camp at Midwestern State University opened on July 16. In 2001, the Cowboys split camp between Midwestern State and the Residence Inn in Oxnard, Calif., spending two weeks at each location.

May 17, 2002 – The Cowboys continued their commitment to fans in the state of Texas by announcing the 2002 training camp will take place at the Alamodome in San Antonio, Texas. The camp, which ran for four weeks, opened on July 26. The Cowboys returned to the Alamodome again in 2003.

Oct. 24, 2003 – The Cowboys announced a return to California for training camp. For the 2004-06 seasons, the Cowboys conducted their entire training camp in Oxnard, Calif., at the Residence Inn at River Ridge, using practice fields provided by The City of Oxnard. The Cowboys opened their first returned camp on July 30, 2004.

May 4, 2006 – The Dallas Cowboys announced a five-year commitment to once again call the City of San Antonio its summer home beginning in 2007. The Alamodome, which played host to Cowboys training camps in 2002 and 2003 was again the site for the team’s summer practice sessions.

Summer, 2010 – The Dallas Cowboys held a split camp, spending the first portion in the Alamodome in San Antonio and the second at the Residence Inn at River Ridge in Oxnard.

July, 2012 – The Dallas Cowboys returned to Oxnard, California for all of training camp at the Residence Inn at River Ridge after spending the 2011 training camp in San Antonio at the Alamodome.

August, 2017 – After spending the first four weeks of training camp in Oxnard, California, the Dallas Cowboys returned home to hold their first ever training camp practices at their new practice facility at The Star in Frisco. Six training camp practices were held inside Ford Center and open to the public.

August, 2020 – For the first time in franchise history, the Cowboys spent all of training camp at The Star in Frisco due to COVID-19 restrictions.

July, 2021 – The Cowboys return to Oxnard, California for training camp after spending 2020 training camp in Frisco.

★ WINNING HEAD COACH ★

The Dallas Cowboys named Mike McCarthy the ninth head coach in franchise history on Jan. 5, 2020. Along with 13 years of head coaching experience and 13 additional years as an assistant coach in the NFL, McCarthy came to Dallas with a 125-77-2 regular season coaching record - all with the Green Bay Packers (2006-18).

After a 42-25 record in four seasons with Dallas, he owns the fifth-most wins (18th all-time) and ninth-highest winning percentage (.620) among qualifying active NFL coaches. His teams have qualified for the postseason 12 times, won six NFC North Division titles and two NFC East titles, made four NFC Championship Game appearances and took home a Super Bowl XLV championship.

★ McCARTHY IN COWBOYS LORE ★

Mike McCarthy has led the Cowboys to double-digit wins in three consecutive seasons for the first time since 1991-96. McCarthy has stacked up wins since he arrived in Dallas in 2020, as his .627 winning percentage with Dallas is the highest among any head coach in franchise history:

★ 2023 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS ★

DAK PRESCOTT

- * Dak Prescott posted a career season in 2023, as he led the NFL in completions (410) and passing touchdowns (36), becoming the first quarterback in franchise history to lead the league outright in touchdown passes. Prescott also became the second quarterback in NFL history to lead the league in touchdown passes just one year after leading the NFL in interceptions.
- * Prescott finished second in the NFL in passer rating (105.9) and completion percentage (69.5%), both career-highs and both second in single-season franchise history.
- * Prescott's 11 games with a 100.0 passer rating-or-better led the NFL in 2023 and tied for the most such games in a season in Cowboys history.

BRYAN ANGER

- * Bryan Anger had the best statistical season of his career and was selected to his second career Pro Bowl. Anger punted 44 times and had a net average of 44.9, second in the NFL, a single-season franchise record and fifth in NFL history. Anger also led the NFL and set the single-season franchise record in gross punting average (51.4).

MICAH PARSONS

- * Micah Parsons finished his third season with a career-high 14.0 sacks, tied for seventh in the NFL. Parsons became the second NFL player since 1982 with at least 12.0 sacks in each of his first three seasons, joining Hall of Famer Reggie White.
- * Parsons has 40.5 career sacks and became the fifth player since 1982 with at least 40.0 career sacks in his first three NFL seasons, joining Reggie White (52.0), Derrick Thomas (43.5), Aldon Smith (42.0) and Dwight Freeney (40.0).
- * Parsons led the NFL with 103 quarterback pressures and a 20.1% pressure rate in 2023, per *Pro Football Focus*. He is just one-of-four players since 2006 with at least 100 pressures in a season, joining J.J. Watt (119 in 2014), Aaron Donald (106 in 2015) and Maxx Crosby (100 in 2021).

BRANDON AUBREY

- * First-year kicker Brandon Aubrey led the NFL in field goals made (36), points scored (157), kickoff touchbacks (99 - NFL record) and ranked third in field goal percentage (94.7%). Aubrey's 157 points scored in 2023 were a single-season franchise record and the most in a player's first season in NFL history.
- * Aubrey made his first 35 field goal attempts in 2023, an NFL record for the most field goals made without a miss to start a career.
- * Aubrey made all 10 field goal attempts from 50-plus yards in 2023, the most 50-yard field goals in a season by a Cowboy and tied for the second-most 50-yard makes in a season in NFL history.

DARON BLAND

- * Second-year cornerback DaRon Bland led the NFL with nine interceptions in 2023 and set an NFL record for most pick-sixes in a season (five). It is the second time in the last three seasons that a Cowboy led the league in interceptions (Trevon Diggs in 2021).
- * Bland has 14 interceptions since he was drafted in 2022, most in the NFL during that span. He also tied Trevon Diggs for the second-most interceptions in a Cowboys player's first two seasons, trailing only Everson Walls (18).

CEEDEE LAMB

- * CeeDee Lamb had the most decorated season of any wide receiver in Cowboys history, setting single-season franchise records in receptions (135 - sixth in NFL history) and receiving yards (1,749 - eighth in NFL history) while scoring a career-best 14 total touchdowns (12 receiving, two rushing), which led all NFL wide receivers in 2023.
- * Lamb had seven games with at least 10 receptions in 2023, most in the NFL, a single-season franchise record and tied for the second-most such games in a season in NFL history, trailing only Michael Thomas (nine in 2019).
- * Lamb also led the league in slot receiving yards (907), yards after catch (680) and tied for the league lead with 29 receptions of 20-plus yards.
- * Lamb had eight 100-yard performances in 2023, a single-season career-high, and the second-most by a Cowboys player in a single season behind only Michael Irvin (11) in 1995.

DALLAS COWBOYS



- * Head Coach Mike McCarthy is the first head coach in Cowboys history to lead the team to 12 wins in three consecutive seasons.
- * Dallas finished 2023 with a +10 turnover differential, marking its third consecutive season with a turnover margin of +10-or-better. It was the first time in franchise history that the Cowboys finished with a turnover margin of +10-or-better in three consecutive seasons and the first NFL team to do so since Kansas City from 2015-17.
- * The Dallas Cowboys sported the NFL's leaders in touchdown passes (Dak Prescott, 36) and receptions (CeeDee Lamb, 135). The last team to have the NFL's passing touchdown leader and receptions leader in the same season was the 2007 New England Patriots (Tom Brady/Wes Welker).

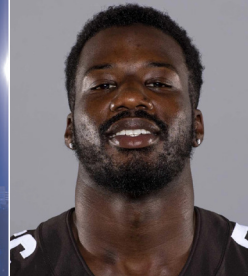

- Appeared in four games with two starts, posting 13 tackles, one pass breakup and one tackle for loss before going on Reserved/Injured with a hamstring injury.

2021 (Minnesota):

- Appeared in 16 games with 12 starts to accumulate 83 tackles, a sack, three quarterback pressures and one pick-six.
- Intercepted Kyler Murray for his first career touchdown at Arizona (9/19).
- Played every defensive snap and recorded 15 tackles, the second-most of his career, at Detroit (12/5).

2020 (LA Chargers):

- Earned three letters in football at Fremont High School in Plain City, Utah, and was a standout at running back and strong safety during his varsity tenure.

- In his senior season, rushed for 1,309 yards (6.2 avg.) with 13 touchdowns and also had 300 receiving yards - adding 61 tackles and an interception on defense.
- Scored 45 career touchdowns, with 3,653 all-purpose yards.
- Earned his degree in sociology from Utah State and earned academic All-Mountain West honors.
- Has a wife, Savannah and a son, Roman.
